The Deck Membership does not include wharf privileges such as dinghy or tender service.

A member may bring a guest to the Club; however, LYC By-Law 51 states that a guest may only visit the Club three times in one year before being required to become a member.

Lunenburg Yacht Club shall not be liable for any damage or injury to members or their guests or to their property occurring on the premises known as the Lunenburg Yacht Club and Lunenburg Yacht Club Marina, or in any common areas thereof. The member agrees to hold the Lunenburg Yacht Club harmless from any claims or damages. The Club recommends that the member obtains insurance to protect himself/herself from any of the above losses.



Membership Categories

Life - Any person who has been a Senior Member for five years or more may become a Life Member upon payment of the fee described on the preceding page. They shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club and they shall be entitled to vote and hold office.

Senior - Any person 19 years of age and older. Senior Members shall be entitled to all of the privileges of the Club; as well, they will be entitled to vote and hold office.

Deck - Any person 19 years of age and older. Deck Members shall be entitled to all of the privileges of the Club. Deck Members shall not be entitled to vote or to serve on the Board of Directors. They may, however, serve on Committees. *The Deck Membership does not include wharf privileges such as dinghy or tender service.*

Introductory - Any person who has not been a member of the Club within the past five years may be admitted as Introductory Members for one year. Introductory Members shall be entitled to all privileges of the Club, but they shall not be entitled to vote or serve on the Board of Directors. They may, however, serve on Committees.

Intermediate - Persons between 19 and 24 years of age inclusive may be admitted as Intermediate Members. They shall be entitled to all privileges of the Club, but they shall not be entitled to vote and they shall not be qualified to serve on the Board of Directors. They may, however, serve on Committees.

Crew - Persons 19 years of age and over may be admitted as Crew Members. They shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club on race days for a period of two hours prior to and immediately following a scheduled race.

Junior - Persons who have not reached their 19th birthday may be admitted as Junior Members, but they shall not be entitled to vote or hold office except in a Junior branch of the Club. Junior application forms must be signed by a parent or guardian and be accepted by the Board of Directors.

Every new candidate for Senior, Spousal, Deck and Introductory membership shall be proposed by a Senior Member and seconded by another Senior Member. Dues for the first year shall accompany the application form.
